- 4. Document growth in student learning and instructional and organizational effectiveness.
- 5. Review the process each year, making revisions as necessary.

The Team expresses appreciation to the pastor, Monsignor Robert Gibbons, as well as the principal, Mrs. Rose Smoot, assistant principal, Sister Joan Carberry, faculty, staff, students, and parents for their warm hospitality during the visit. All members of the school community were most gracious during the many opportunities for discussions and meetings.
