One of the most difficult commands that Jesus has called us to is that we must forgive those who have hurt us and who have hurt those we love. Loving like this is difficult. It is truly tough love that is willing to let go of the hurt and release the offender from the debt that they owe. During the month of November the faculty and students will be reflecting on the virtue of **FORGIVENESS**. Forgiveness means letting go of hard feelings such as anger, sadness, or frustration that happens when we or someone else makes a mistake. It's saying "Thank you" or "That's okay" when someone apologizes and not staying upset about what they did.

Forgiveness is having patience with ourselves and others, and recognizing that no one is perfect—everyone makes mistakes. It's letting go of hurt feelings, and moving on. Before we can forgive others we must first be able to forgive ourselves. In one of his letters Pope Francis said, "Forgiveness is the way to resume new life." How can we challenge ourselves and the members of our family to be ready to forgive each other as God forgives us? How can we as a family resume new life when such is needed?
